# Santa Maria Combines Programs To Workforce Development

Earlier this year Santa Maria worked toward combining its Price Hill Financial Opportunity Center (FOC) and Literacy Center West (LCW) programs under one overarching title: "Workforce Development."

The LCW location will continue to provide GED preparation, but now offers financial and housing education as well.

Employment workshops and job-seeking services are now conducted at the FOC location. In-house employment services are offered to all ages through group Employment Workshops. These bi-weekly workshops are facilitated over a 3-day span helping job seekers with pre-employment and job readiness skills.

Since its inception, 91 have graduated the Employment Workshop series and 78 job seekers have secured employment. Six youth graduates have completed a 6-week pre-apprenticeship training where they gained OSHA 10 along with other industry recognized certificates. Three of those youth are currently employed in the construction industry making \$30+ per hour.

Sean Reynolds, a recently employed Workshop graduate said, "The Workforce Development Program at Santa Maria is the place to make things happen. It is a blessing to all who take advantage of its many resources."

# Santa Maria Every Child Succeeds Family Raises Them Up... ...

Krystal and Kenbrell came to Cincinnati in 2011. The couple grew up in Miami, Florida, and were both athletic individuals valuing education as they came to Cincinnati to pursue college. Krystal, a Xavier University student studying sociology, and Kenbrell, a University of Cincinnati student studying business, found a need to have Santa Maria Community Services involved in their lives.

Krystal enrolled in the Santa Maria Every Child Succeeds program. Krystal was a prenatal parent and met Santa Maria home visitor Colleen Healey weekly to learn of prenatal development and community support for her family. Krystal delivered a healthy baby boy who later earned the moniker of "K2." Krystal met with Colleen weekly as he began to grow. K2 developed meeting his milestones in all areas: motor, intellectual, social emotional, and language development.

As any active boy, K2 was moving about: crawling, walking, running, and later kicking, throwing, and catching balls. K2 was exposed to athletics very early because his parents took him to University of Cincinnati football games to watch his father, Kenbrell Thompkins, a wide receiver, play football as a Bearcat.

Krystal was an active mother in the Every Child Succeeds program, participating in the gatherings of moms throughout the year. Krystal mentioned the Parky's Farm event through the Every Child Succeeds Parent Group, recently commenting "... we participated in the Parky's farm event...it was our first time experiencing anything like it. It was nice to hang out with other moms." Krystal commented also on the home visits and the delivery of age appropriate curriculum to her through the program, "The monthly curriculum is what I loved. It kept me on track and my son advanced...his vocabulary is expanding on a daily basis!" Krystal reports that Kenbrell or K2 is advanced for his age with great language skills.

Krystal continued her involvement in other ways throughout her time with Every Child Succeeds. Krystal was a volunteer for the Santa Maria East Price Hill front desk administrative assistant and was a Literacy Center West tutor for the youth earning their GEDs. Krystal was encouraging to the young teens and adults she met through Santa Maria's programs. She would still be involved in the Santa Maria Agency of programs if her journey had not taken a detour...and a great detour it was!

Thanks to an Interact For Health Join the Fun grant that was awarded to Santa Maria at the beginning of 2014, a FREE run/walk training group was formed to prepare individuals to compete in the Price Hill Pacer 5K. And the group continues moving!

The next Price Hill Pacer 5K/10K will be in Summer 2015 to benefit Santa Maria Community Services and Price Hill Will, and the training group is preparing by running and walking all around Price Hill.

The goal of the International Welcome Center's Entrepreneur Program is to encourage and support female entrepreneurs in Price Hill as they seek financial stability for their families.

Santa Maria partnered with the Greater Cincinnati Microenterprise Initiative to teach participants about starting a business. In addition to covering basic accounting and management skills, the Entrepreneur Program focuses on hands-on education in product creation and production. This program helps participants in their goal of attaining financial independence while providing them with an outlet to connect with other business-minded women in the community.

Jenny Ginocchio, a long-time Santa Maria Community Services' volunteer, taught this group of powerful women about jewelrymaking. And some of the participants are already selling the jewelry they're creating! At the end of the summer program, the most advanced students completed an auction project that showcases the jewelry-making skills they learned. This bohemian-style jewelry set pictured on the left was completed by Rena Kato (earrings), Yukiko Suzuki (necklace) and Astou Sawane (bracelet).

### **Boost Your Health - Volunteer!**



United Health Care released a survey identifying some of the key benefits of volunteering. More than 4,000 American adults participated.

Approximately 68% of those persons reported feeling physically healthier since volunteering during the previous 12 months. More than 85% stated they experienced an improved sense of well-being. Others reported lower levels of stress, better management of chronic illnesses and more of a sense of purpose.



Santa Maria programming involves volunteers year-round. Besides special events like the Price Hill Pacer 5K, Health Fairs and Birthday Brunch there are many ways to be involved. Some of our ongoing volunteer needs include: tutoring middle school students, tutoring GED participants, assisting with group financial education, conducting mock interviews with job seekers, child care for adult classes, program material

The Youth Enrichment Program strives to develop leadership in immigrant youth while helping them find their passion and interest in life. Youth develop invaluable skills and gain knowledge that will help them grow to become leaders.

The first step in this development is to find the spark that is in every child. Santa Maria's International Welcome Center aspires to help children find their passions and interests in life by providing them with opportunities to explore.

Youth of the International Welcome Center are introduced to speakers from various organizations such as IMAGO (a grassroots, environmental education organization), the Price Hill Public Library, Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra, District 3 Police Department, etc.. These experiences will help them discover their personal interests while encouraging them to be curious and active individuals.



# Price Hill Women's Health Fair Provides Vital Services

Women's health was front and center at the Price Hill Women's Health Fair in early October at Elder High School's Schaeper Center.

Through Santa Maria Community Services,

the University of Cincinnati Medical Center, the YWCA, St. Elizabeth Hospital, Healthy Moms and Babes, and the YMCA, screenings for glucose, BMI, blood pressure, mammograms, STI, pregnancy and A1C were offered to the 58 health fair participants.

Other wellness service providers at the fair included Enroll America (provided help with enrolling for health insurance), the Good Samaritan Free Health Center, Medicaid Managed Care Plans (Buckeye Community Health Plan, CareSource and Paramount Advantage), and Center for Closing the Health Gap (nutrition information).

Free child care was provided, as well as refreshments, Zumba demonstrations and raffles. This event was a great way to focus on women's health, provide important screenings, and help women access the medical services they need for themselves and their families.
